Evaluation of the situation at Paris-Orly airport at 9 a.m.

Due to difficulties to provide aircraft with fuel, departing traffic was interrupted this morning at Paris-Orly airport. Traffic returned to normal a little before 9 a.m. Arriving traffic is normal.

The aviation fuel suppliers working with airlines operating at Paris-Orly airport had met difficulties linked to the specificity of their material this morning. Fuel supply is subject to safety rules.

As of 6.30 a.m., the runways and taxiways were totally cleared at Paris-Orly and the airport was operational.

All the access roads to planes have been operational and safe since 6.30 a.m.
