Aéroports de Paris welcomes Airbus A380 first commercial flight to Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport

Aéroports de Paris welcomed early this morning a Singapore Airlines Airbus A380 at terminal 1 of Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport. At 6.38 a.m., the aircraft arriving from Singapore touched down on runway 3 at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport.

The 450 passengers arriving from Singapore disembarked within 15 minutes. The 326 passengers, departing on flight SQ334, have hence inaugurated the first Airbus A380 commercial flight between Paris and Singapore. The passengers boarded in 35 minutes (including a 15 minute wait for last minute passengers at airline's request). The Airbus A380 was ready for take off at 12.24 p.m., the scheduled flight time.

The arrival of the Airbus A380 at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport took place in optimal conditions. This success is the result of 8 years of work carried out by Aéroports de Paris teams. The Airbus A380 had already landed three times at Paris-Charles de Gaulle to better prepare for the launch of a scheduled air service.

The arrival of the Airbus A380 is a real asset for Aéroports de Paris. It is in line with the Group's industrial strategy. Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport is the first scheduled destination of the Airbus A380 in France and is part of the major airports ready to accommodate the aircraft.

Since 2002, all the new facilities whether new runways, new taxiways or boarding lounges such as la Galerie Parisienne have been designed to be compatible with this type of plane. In parallel, existing facilities have been upgraded to meet European standards regarding the Airbus A380.
