Adverse weather conditions on 2 February 2009

Evaluation of the situation at 6 p.m.

► Traffic is progressively going back to normal at Paris airports

Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport

- Number of operational runways: all four.
- No traffic regulation
- Average remaining delays since 3 p.m.: 20 minutes.

Paris-Orly airport

- Number of operational runways: all two.
- No traffic regulation
- Average remaining delays since 3 p.m.: 40 minutes.

Aéroports de Paris advises passengers to contact their airline in order to get more information about their flight. There can still be delays for two reasons:

- **European airport closed or congested (Heathrow, Amsterdam...)**
- **accumulated delays on some flights.**

Adverse weather conditions in Europe are causing delays in traffic between Paris and Great-Britain. Flights departing from Heathrow are postponed until 5 p.m., Gatwick was temporarily closed last night, and London City will be closed all day.
