Accident involving a person during a maintenance operation on the electric system at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport: operations back to normal

Further to an accident involving a technician at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport during a maintenance operation, power was temporarily interrupted in terminals 1 and 2AB as a precaution.

The priority, in this type of situation, is given to emergency services and the police while technical operations are taken care of in a second phase.

This situation has had no impact on security as security staff proceeded to manual checks of all passengers and their baggage. Parts of the airport (air navigation, control tower, runway lighting, airport safety systems...) were provided with electricity thanks to the internal emergency power supply systems.

All the technical teams of Aéroports de Paris are mobilized and the situation is now back to normal
