Paris airports: evaluation of the situation at 7.30 a.m.

- **Teams mobilized all night**
- **No delays**

Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport

- Opening of snow command center: Thursday 12 February at 9 p.m.
- Snow removal teams: nearly 150 employees have been at work since the beginning of the snow event (2 a.m.) to clear the runways, taxiways, aircraft stands and road network.
- Number of runways opened: all four. All the runways are operational and safe.
- Maximum de-icing capacities: 7 bays opened

Paris-Orly airport

- Snow removal teams : 50 people have been at work since midnight to preventively clear the runways and taxiways
- Traffic is normal, concentrated on one runway.
