**Snowfall in Ile de France region:
11 a.m. update on situation at Paris airports**

- **Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport:**

Traffic is normal.

- **Paris-Orly airport:**

Exceptional snowfall episodes have been continuously affecting the South of Ile de France since 1 a.m. and have caused traffic disruptions at Paris-Orly airport.

These exceptional adverse weather conditions (10 centimetres of snow on the ground and continuous snow showers) are causing flight delays and cancellations and some flights are diverted to Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport.

All Aéroports de Paris are mobilized to clear the runways in order to guarantee the best safety conditions for air traffic and airport operations.

Aéroports de Paris advises passengers to contact their airlines, before travelling to Paris-Orly airport, to check if their flight has not been delayed or cancelled.
