Midday update

Adverse weather conditions are disrupting air traffic at several airports in Europe and North America. The airports concerned are Brussels, Frankfurt, Düsseldorf, Berlin, Manchester, Amsterdam, Madrid, Vienna, Washington, New York and Boston. As a result, **airlines are experiencing turnaround problems due to these bad weather conditions. This can lead to delays or even cancellations at Paris airports.**

At this hour, average arrivals and departures delays are one hour at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and thirty minutes at Paris-Orly.

Aéroports de Paris advises again passengers to contact their airline to check if their flight has not been cancelled. In case the flight is cancelled, Aéroports de Paris invites passengers to not go to the airport.
